Summary of the Board of Directors' work session on October 9, 2014

The Board normally does not take formal action in work sessions.

The Board:

Received information on OWASA's biosolids management program and staff's proposal to develop a long-term plan. On November 13th, staff will give the Board a proposed scope of work for developing the plan.

Discussed the Jordan Lake Partnership's draft water supply plan for the Triangle region, which is consistent with OWASA's 2010 long-range water supply plan. The Board agreed to have a resolution supporting the Partnership's plan on the agenda for the October 23rd meeting.

Discussed the proposed scope for a study of total compensation of employees. Staff will submit a revised schedule based on intent to select a consultant by July 2015.

With the goal of ensuring OWASA's rate structure effectively supports affordability and conservation objectives, the Board discussed potential changes to the manner in which the organization charges for water and sewer services.

The Board plans to continue discussions about potential alternative rate structures through the fiscal year. The process for considering rate structure changes will include opportunities for the community to comment and provide input.
