## Summary of the OWASA Board of Directors' Public Hearings and Meeting on May 25, 2017

### **The Board of Directors:**

- **Received an update from staff regarding work to resolve taste and odor in drinking water. The earthy taste and odor reported by customers since May 12<sup>th</sup> results from algae in OWASA's lakes. Our water continues to be safe for drinking and other uses.**
- **Held public hearings on the proposed budget for July 2017 through June 2018 and rates proposed to be effective in October 2017.** No increase in monthly rates is needed for the sixth consecutive year. The Board received comments from a customer who opposes funding for fluoridation of drinking water. The Board will consider approving the budget and rates in the June 8<sup>th</sup> meeting.
- **Asked staff to draft a plan by June 2018 for community engagement regarding forestry management.**
- **Asked staff to prepare a plan by June 2018 for solar photovoltaic projects on OWASA land.**
- **Agreed that the Board's Natural Resources and Technical Services Committee will meet to make recommendations on analyzing options for evaluating OWASA land for potential sale.**
- **Discussed a petition to televise Board meetings in Carrboro, and asked staff for additional information.**
- **Approved an agreement with Orange County under which the County will own sewers to be installed in the Rogers Road area and OWASA will operate and maintain them.**

**Chair John Young announced that the Chapel Hill Town Council has reappointed Ruchir Vora and appointed John Morris to serve on the OWASA Board.**
