Summary of the OWASA Board of Directors' Meeting on July 14, 2022

The Board of Directors:

- Welcomed four new Board members: Pedro Garcia and David Gorelick, appointed by the Town of Chapel Hill, as well as Melody Kramer and Elmira Mangum, appointed by the Town of Carrboro.
- Approved the Long-Range Water Supply Plan. This plan was updated to project OWASA's water resource needs and how to best serve customers through 2070.
- Eliminated OWASA's Account Delinquency Fee to support OWASA's goal of providing equitable services to the community. The Account Delinquency Fee was previously charged when customers were disconnected for non-payment.
- Agreed to cancel the August 11, 2022 Board Meeting.
