Summary of the OWASA Board of Directors' Annual Meeting on October 13, 2022

The Board of Directors:

- Received the draft Annual Comprehensive Financial Report for the fiscal year ended June 30, 2022. Martin, Starnes, and Associates recently completed its audit and issued an unmodified opinion, which means that the independent auditor found OWASA's financial records and statements to be appropriate and comply with Generally Accepted Accounting Principles.
- Received the Operating Trends Report for Fiscal Year 2022. The report summarizes observed trends in customer demands, water supply and drinking water treatment, wastewater treatment, the reclaimed water system and environmental regulations to ensure OWASA continues providing high-quality services.
- Received lake recreation frequently asked questions and agreed to remove the Annual Lake Report from the Board's 12-Month Board Meeting Schedule.
- Received an update on the development of a new budget format to provide more insight into the budget process and enhance decision-making for the Board.
